

# The Books of the Bible: Philippians

David Price

Each one of Paul's letters provides us new insights into living in the light and truth of God's grace. As we prayerfully read and/or study them we find more and more guidance, whether it be with respect to our relationship to God or to our fellow man. We may find a passage that more deeply expresses some aspect of the gospel helping us to see it more clearly. Or we may find one that corrects some direction we might be heading in our own lives. Either way, if we let it into our heart, we will grow closer into living the life that God desires us to live. James tells us in his letter (James 4:8 - NASV) Draw near to God and He will draw near to you.

Philippi is in Greece. At the time that Paul wrote however, it was a Roman colony, governed by the laws of Rome rather than the surrounding province. It was overwhelmingly gentile. At the time Paul wrote this letter, he was a prisoner in Rome, however in no way did that dampen his faith and joy in the gospel message. Here are just a few highlights. Unless otherwise noted all are from the New American Standard Version.

(Philippians 1:9-11) <sup>9</sup>And this I pray, that your love may abound still more and more in real knowledge and all discernment, <sup>10</sup>so that you may approve the things that are excellent, in order to be sincere and blameless until the day of Christ; <sup>11</sup>having been filled with the fruit of righteousness which comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God.

(Philippians 2:5-11) <sup>5</sup>Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, 6who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, <sup>7</sup>but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. 8Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. 9For this reason also, God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name, 10so that at the name of Jesus EVERY KNEE WILL BOW, of those who are in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup> and that every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

(Philippians 2:14-15) <sup>14</sup>Do all things without grumbling or disputing; <sup>15</sup>so that you will prove yourselves to be blameless and innocent, children of God above reproach in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you appear as lights in the world,

(Philippians 3:7-9) <sup>7</sup>But whatever things were gain to me, those things I have counted as loss for the sake of Christ. <sup>8</sup>More than that, I count all things to be loss in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them but rubbish so that I may gain Christ, <sup>9</sup>and may be found in Him, not having a righteousness of my own derived from the Law, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which comes from God on the basis of faith,

(Philippians 3:13-14) <sup>13</sup>Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of it yet; but one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead, <sup>14</sup>I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

(Philippians 4:6-8) <sup>6</sup>Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. <sup>7</sup>And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

(Philippians 4:8) <sup>8</sup>Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence and if anything worthy of praise, dwell on these things.

(Philippians 4:13 – MKJV) <sup>13</sup>I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me. □

- Reflection: Meditate on the hope of resurrection and the promise of new life in Christ.  $\square$




